

Dear Brother Knight,

As the world reels from the coronavirus crisis, the Knights of Columbus continues to serve: providing the charitable, spiritual and financial resources relied on by so many.

Early action at the Supreme Council headquarters meant that we began working remotely in mid-March, ensuring the health and safety of our workforce, and the continuity of our business operations with minimal disruption. Our employees are putting the "home" in "home office," as they continue their work with the utmost commitment and excellence. The Order's agency force has also embraced working virtually. Agents continue to meet and advise members about their insurance and financial needs, but now they do so online through secure Skype appointments. The financial services and products we offer are important in normal circumstances; they are vital during this pandemic.

The Knights of Columbus remains financially strong. On April 6, Standard and Poor's ranked life insurers on their ability to weather the coronavirus storm. Of hundreds of life insurers in North America, the Knights of Columbus was one of only six to earn the top ranking.

Responding to the pandemic, in March we launched a new initiative — "Leave No Neighbor Behind" — and councils worldwide are already implementing it, providing critical support in neighborhoods and parishes, donating blood, and ensuring that no one is forgotten. The Supreme Council has also launched a multimillion-dollar campaign to support food banks in the United States and Canada, and we are providing a financial lifeline for dioceses as well.

These efforts complement the countless ways that brother Knights are helping the sick, the hungry and others in need. Our charitable work in North America is so significant that the White House has asked for regular updates on our relief efforts.

During this pandemic we have also adapted from in-person meetings to having councils conduct essential business remotely. The Supreme Council has also provided a platform to allow every jurisdiction to hold a virtual state convention. The means of connecting has changed, but our proud tradition of faith in action has not.


Our actions have been a powerful witness, and a recent degree ceremony, held online, produced the largest number of new members from a single event in our Order's history. The Supreme Council is hosting our new Exemplification of Charity, Unity and Fraternity online every Thursday. In addition, our eMembership option continues to provide a quick and easy way for men to join our brotherhood.

The Knights of Columbus has risen to meet every challenge we have faced since 1882. In fact, COVID-19 is the third pandemic in our Order's history. As we have always done before, we will prevail and do immense good during this time. Not only will the Order come through this crisis; we will make a decisive difference in ensuring that our parishes, communities and countries do the same.

Food Banks



When you are unable to receive Holy Communion, you can make an Act of Spiritual Communion. To do so express your faith in Christ and in His Presence in the Eucharist, and ask Him to unite Himself with you. The basic elements of an Act of Spiritual Communion are an Act of Faith, an Act of Love, a desire to receive Christ, and an invitation to Him to come into your heart.

The following text presents a popular form of an Act of Spiritual Communion written by St. Alphonsus de Liguori. Simply face the Tabernacle if you are in a Church or Chapel or, if at home, face the direction of the closest Church.

My Jesus,

I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.

I love You above all things,

and I desire to receive You into my soul.

Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.

I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.



State Raffle Ticket Sales Final Days Approaching

More on the State Charity Raffle...

The K of C Charity Raffle has been a very successful way to generate money for 501c3 organization that need money to do God's work and help needy people survive. The K of C Raffle started in 1986. Sometime after the year 2000 the name was changed to 'Vacation Raffle'. In 2010 the name was change to 'Charity Raffle'. Starting in 2004 through 2019, Arizona Knights collected \$3,753,419 via the raffle. Over those years the expenses to conduct the raffle averaged 15%. Therefore, the Knights have generated \$3,190,406 for charity. Expenses include the prize money, printing material, and conducting the raffle using only volunteers. Last year the state sales were \$330,782.

Since 2004, Corpus Christi Council 10062 sold the most tickets in the state. This was not an accident; our Brother Knights have done a great job of selling or buying the raffle tickets. Our council has a culture of supporting all charity projects. Since 2014 Council 10062 turned in \$110,300 with an average of \$22,060 a year in sales. A total of \$55,150 went to support St Vincent de Paul since half our sales stay in our parish. All expenses are taken out of the State Council half of sales.

The dollar amount sold is one way to tracking monies collected for charity. Another way is to track the number of members that participate in the projects. I frequently hear that only a few Knights participate. Not true, they probably are looking at a single event. They do not see Brother Knights that help serve the Masses on the weekend as ushers, readers, money counters; spend time in the Chapel; drive cars for the Phoenix Open; or help with the Pancake breakfast.

We also track the number of Knights that sell or buy Charity Raffle tickets. We have anywhere from 30% to the highest of 44%. This year is going to be a challenge for us as we can not mail tickets to all members and due to COVID-19 all churches are closed. We need all members to realize that this year everyone must help by selling or buying tickets. The money goes to St Vincent de Paul.

A word on food vulnerability

I recently received an email that cautioned its readers to avoid purchasing any food processed, or imported from China. The following is my take on purchasing any food from <u>any</u> Oriental country but especially China.

First, permit me to qualify myself. My career spanned nearly 50 years in the food industry. Some of that was at the retail level, working inside supermarkets. Additional years were spent in a huge food processing plant where numerous edible products were processed. For more than a decade, I managed hundreds of millions of dollars of meat and meat products sold to grocery stores and supermarket chains. Since my retirement from that industry nearly 30 years ago, much has changed!

It is reported that Smithfield Farms, the largest pork producing farm in America was sold to China. Brands affected include Morrell, Eckrich, Krahus, Cudahy, Cook's Premium Hams, and Gwaltney. Be careful what you buy!

It is reported that chickens are shipped to China and come back labeled "RAISED IN THE USA." Most are sold in frozen form to fast food restaurants for sandwiches, school lunches and supermarkets. Be careful what you buy!

It is a fact that China slaughters and processing protocols are far from equal to the United States requirements for sanitation and safety. It is a fact that most food products coming out of China are raised and harvested under the most putrefied circumstances. (I won't offer details, but use your imagination. At the very least, think sewage.)

We are cautioned that foreign farm raised fish, in general, should not be eaten because of the high concentration of antibiotics fed to them to prevent diseases due to being tightly confined with other fish. Worse, they are frequently fed chicken feces. Who wants our families to eat that fish?

Buy wild caught fish from North America, Hawaii or New Zealand.

NEVER buy any type of fish or shellfish that comes from these countries: Vietnam, China, or Philippines. No knowledgeable or responsible person will recommend them.

Simply look on the bottom of every product you buy, <u>including packaged fruits and vegetables</u>, and if it says 'Made in China' or 'PRC' (and that includes Hong Kong), simply choose another product, or none at all.

Send this to everybody you know. Let's show the Orientals, especially China, that we are intelligent consumers and NOBODY can take us for granted.

Start reading labels more closely and buy something else even if it cost a few cents more. It's worth a few pennies more to know you're getting AMERICAN QUALITY food!

Think about this: if you eat in restaurants a lot, then you have no idea what you're eating!
