
WM Open Driving 2021

ney. So after approximately 150 man hour these men earned \$2076.00 for our Council! Thank you men (you know who you are)!



Waste Management Open Driving? Details to Follow

Paul and Bill,

Hope you both are doing well and being safe during our lovely Covid world. I sure hope you and your families are doing ok. Just wanted to touch base with both of you after talking with Paul last week. We are working on plans for the WMPO and I know Amanda from the TBirds has also been in touch. I just wanted to give you some preliminary details on our plans and have a few questions for you.

With Covid we have a few items that will need to change this year to ensure both safety for your team and cleanliness for the vehicles.

- We are planning our prep week for vehicles Jan. 18-22. If our normal plans happen we would release a few vehicles to you for the TBirds on Jan. 20 with the remaining keys being turned over on Jan. 22.
- Prep location will be Salt River Fields (our original location from a few years ago) at the Home Plate Parking lot next to Pima Road. See attached map.
- Most likely the drop points for you on the Player vehicles will change from our normal years. We will still have an airport drop but it is TBD at this point if it is at the Valet or another location. Most likely the Princess will not happen and the rest of the vehicles will be dropped at the Soccer Fields where the Bird's Nest is normally. More to come on that.
- This year we are renting Vans from Enterprise vs. getting Transit vans from Dealers. So a few things here.
- o I will need a copy of the drivers license from your 7 or so primary drivers. You can send those to me anytime. We will need those to make sure they are added to the Insurance policy for driving those.
- o We'll plan to have those Vans for you on Jan. 19 or 20 depending on when you want to pick them up. Base on last year's calendar I would assume you'll use those through Feb. 16.
- o All KofC staff will be required to wear a Face Mask during all work time. I'm sure you all have those already so just plan to wear what you have. We will also have latex gloves to ensure the inside of the vehicles stay clean.

After the Tournament we will once again collect all vehicles at Salt River Fields for post inspection and recleaning. We will plan to release the vehicles back to you to deliver to the respective dealers on Feb. 11 and 12.

We are looking forward to another year and we'll do our best to ensure everyone remains safe during this time. Let me know if you have any questions

Safe Environment RENEWAL TRAINING

Annual Online Training:
"Renewing Our Commitment"

The Diocese of Phoenix is committed to protecting all children and youth by offering, at all Diocesan parishes, several abuse prevention educational sessions. The Diocesan Policy and Procedure for the Protection of Minors requires all clergy, employees, volunteers that directly serve minors, and minors to attend training on an annual basis. All other volunteers in the parish must attend Safe Environment training every other year. In Catholic education grades Pre-k through high school, every student every year participates in a Safe Environment program.

In the Diocese of Phoenix all adult volunteers must complete Called to Protect for Ministries as a foundation course for Safe Environment. Called to Protect for Ministries is a 3 hour program which will teach steps that can be taken to prevent child sexual abuse and as a component of the training everyone is required to complete a volunteer application and Code of Ethics.

A 45 minute renewal Training is offered for all subsequent years. This training is offered through inclass sessions at the parish or through computer "online" training.



2 After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi^[a] from the east came to Jerusalem² and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to

worship him."

³ When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. ⁴ When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. 5 "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written:

⁶ "But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

for out of you will come a ruler

who will shepherd my people Israel.' [b]"

⁷ Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. ⁸ He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go

⁹ After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰ When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. ¹¹ On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. ¹² And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.

On December 21, many of us witnessed the great "conjunction" of the planets Jupiter and Saturn. Supposedly this natural occurrence would resemble the "Christmas Star". How many of your friends or relatives mentioned that they indeed saw the "Christmas Star"? I know a few of mine did. I had been taught that there is only ONE Christmas Star. The star of Bethlehem guided the Magi to the Christ Child so that they could bare witness to his presence, greet and present him with gifts of gold, frankingense and myrrh.

In a time when much throughout the world is not ideal, many will seek some comfort in things that may offer hope or a change for the better or even just make one smile. While the great conjunction might be a once in a lifetime event, it should not be referred to as nor should ever be compared to the "Christmas Star".

I suppose if you look long and hard enough at the sky on Christmas Eve, you might be able to focus on a star or two that you could call A Christmas Star, but let's not forget that THE Star was present only for one reason over 2000 years ago.

Keep Christ In Christmas...

In November/December, Council 10062 held its annual "Keep Christ in Christmas" poster contest - one of the longest running council programs having been instituted in the early years of the Council's founding by recently deceased Brother John Rajczyk. The Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest is officially sanctioned by the Knights of Columbus under the authority of the state deputy and state youth director. Winning posters selected at the Council level may be submitted for subsequent competitions at the District, Regional and State levels. Poster blanks and instructions were distributed in early November to children attending Religious Education at Corpus Christi in grades Kindergarten to 5th grade, and also after all masses on November 8 to parish children not enrolled in RE classes at Corpus Christi. Posters were submitted by December 2 for judging. Each child submitting a poster receives a gold-tone ornament shaped like a Christmas tree with the cut-out words "Keep Christ in Christmas". Winning posters receive an ornament of Santa bowing in the manger before the Christ child, and the words "at his name, all knees shall bow". All posters are laminated and displayed in the church courtyard through the Advent Season. This year's program was conducted by Mike Moore, Brendan O'Hare, and Rich Lastra.

54 Day Novena Now Through January 21

Brother Knights,

Our Worthy State Treasurer Tom Kato has suggested that we, the Knights of Columbus of Arizona, pray a 54 day novena together for those we know that have fallen away from the faith. We will begin the novena on November 28th and it will end on January 21, 2021. The novena will be named "Welcome Home, Brothers and Sisters". We would like to tie it in to the upcoming Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays, when our families will be gathering. We are praying for our family members to 'come home' and celebrate and live our faith with us. The first 27 days are to offer requests for the intention and the final 27 days are for thanksgiving.

The intention should be specific, starting with a prayer to St. Monica for children or family members, followed by a rosary, then a prayer for lapsed Catholics. Encourage your councils to pray this novena; there is strength in group prayer. This would also count as a council program if enough members participate.

PRAYERS

Prayer to Saint Monica

Throne of the Holy One, for the sake of my child, [Name], who has wandered from the faith, and all that we have tried to teach.

I know, dear Monica, that our children belong not to us, but to God, and that God often permits this wandering as part of one's journey toward Him.

Your son, Augustine, wandered, too; eventually he found the faith, and came to believe, and in that belief became a true teacher.

Help me, therefore, to have patience, and to believe that all things — even this disappointing movement away from the faith — work ultimately to His own good purposes.

For the sake of my child's soul, I pray to understand and trust in this.

St. Monica, please teach me to persist in faithful prayer as you did for your son's sake.

Inspire me to behave in ways that will not further distance my child from Christ, but only draw [Name] gently towards his marvelous light.

Please teach me what you know about this painful mystery of separation, and how it is reconciled in the re-orientation of our children toward heaven.

O Saint Monica, lover of Christ and His Church, pray for me, and for my child [Name], that we may acquire heaven, joining with you, there, in offering constant and thankful praise to God, Amen.

They are now forgetful of their duties as Catholics, and pursue the pleasures of the world.


Grant that they may quickly return to the practice of every Christian virtue, so that their lives may shine with the integrity of faith, the fervor of piety, and the ardor of charity.





To do so express your faith in Christ and in His Presence in the Eucharist, and ask Him to unite Himself with you. The basic elements of an Act of Spiritual Communion are an Act of Faith, an Act of Love, a desire to receive Christ, and an invitation to Him to come into your heart.

The following text presents a popular form of an Act of Spiritual Communion written by St. Alphonsus de Liguori. Simply face the Tabernacle if you are in a Church or Chapel or, if at home, face the direction of the closest Church.


My Jesus,

and I desire to receive You into my soul.

Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.
