My Brothers,

As you might know, the number of new COVID cases in Arizona and around the country have decreased tremendously during the last five weeks. The three dioceses in Arizona are modifying their protocols with regards to mass attendance and also on what and how activities can take place on parishes' grounds.

I am pleased to inform you that starting March 1st, 2021 I will be allowing councils and assemblies in all dioceses to conduct both indoor and outdoor in-person meetings and events until further notice provided that all diocesan and parish guidelines are followed. This includes getting approval from your pastor and following strict COVID related precautions. I strongly recommend that, where possible, you would run your meetings in a hybrid mode (in-person and online) so that those members who cannot attend in-person could participate virtually. Also please offer to take on any additional labor needed to prepare and clean any facilities used for meetings and other activities to lessen the load on staff.

We as a jurisdiction have suffered significantly during the last 12 months of the pandemic. I hope that during this time of reduced activity councils and assemblies have been reflecting on how they will hit the ground running when restrictions start being relaxed. Please start contacting your pastors now to find out how the Knights of Columbus can help in their efforts, in some cases, to reopen their doors.

We also need to put all our efforts together to organize recruitment efforts. As Pope Francis declared, this is the Year of St. Joseph. And March is usually the month dedicated to St. Joseph. And March 29 is Founders Day. Let us pray through the intercession of St. Joseph to use this time to redouble our efforts to bring more men into your councils!

We also need to increase our Faith In Action programs that have mostly been conducted virtually. As always, our State Membership Director Bobby Nielsen, our State Programs Director Tom White, your District Deputies, your State Officers and State Leaders will always be there to help you get restarted and re-energized.

Safe Environment RENEWAL TRAINING

Annual Online Training:
"Renewing Our Commitment"

The Diocese of Phoenix is committed to protecting all children and youth by offering, at all Diocesan parishes, several abuse prevention educational sessions. The Diocesan Policy and Procedure for the Protection of Minors requires all clergy, employees, volunteers that directly serve minors, and minors to attend training on an annual basis. All other volunteers in the parish must attend Safe Environment training every other year. In Catholic education grades Pre-k through high school, every student every year participates in a Safe Environment program.

In the Diocese of Phoenix all adult volunteers must complete Called to Protect for Ministries as a foundation course for Safe Environment. Called to Protect for Ministries is a 3 hour program which will teach steps that can be taken to prevent child sexual abuse and as a component of the training everyone is required to complete a volunteer application and Code of Ethics.

A 45 minute renewal Training is offered for all subsequent years. This training is offered through inclass sessions at the parish or through computer "online" training.





Lecturers Wanted



We come to you with confidence, knowing that you truly are our compassionate Mother, health of the sick and cause of our joy.


