It is as if you hand the members of Christ over to a whorehouse. What hope can you have in God? Indeed what hope can anyone have who agrees with you...? God will be the judge. For as scripture says, it is not only the evildoers who will be damned but also those who support them. St. Patrick- 'Letter to Coroticus'

For those who haven't heard, there was an "incident" at Saint Patrick's Cathedral in New York City this past month. A funeral service was held for a transgender, atheist prostitute at what is perhaps the preeminent Cathedral in the United States. St. Patrick, whose feast we celebrate this month, patron saint of the Archdiocese of New York, bishop, Apostle to Ireland and perhaps also a prophet, which is fortunate for if he were around to deliver this message today, he would be branded a *rigorist* by the Pope of mercy.

The funeral, presided over by a Catholic priest whose vestiture was penitential purple (news reports did not say how long the lines were for confession), was well attended by a not very diverse group of well-wishers who whooped it up with sacrilegious chants and dancing before an "icon" of the newly deceased he/she, "St. Cecilia, mother of all whores" (their words not mine).

The reigning Archbishop of New York, Timothy Cardinal Dolan, in damage control mode, expressed disappointment at the irreverence shown in his parish church as if it was the level of noise that was the problem and not the fact of the "Mass" turned "funeral service" itself. The presiding priest fortunately did not perform the rituals in Latin or else he would have been shipped off to an ecclesial gulag stripped of his faculties and vested in ashes and sackcloth.

Cathedrals are important ecclesiastical edifices. Housing as they do the cathedra, the seat where the bishop exercises his priestly duty 'to proclaim Christ's gospel authentically'. They are

built, over long periods of time, by generations of men who may never see its completion, for the benefit of those who will come after them. The monies raised are usually gotten not from a superfluidity of wealth, but from the offerings of poverty. The reward, in this instance, was the mockery of their religion.

Why does the Church find it so difficult to speak the truth of the gospel? When did license become Christian love? Why do we equate Jesus with the cartoonish caricatures of the Him we see on tv shows? Who are these men who pervert Catholic social teaching, creating a society which allows self-indulgence to the point of perversion in a mindless spirit of live and let live, and a false mercy which serves to perpetuate intemperance. When they allow such things to come into the house of the Lord I am reminded of the words of Themistocles, "I do not admire the sort of men who use the same vessel as a wine pitcher and a chamber pot."

Saints come out of circumstance, not out of thin air, and a man becomes a Christian he is not born one. St. Patrick was a slave and in his own words the smallest among all the faithful. Brought from his native Britain to Ireland, alone among strangers where "the Lord revealed to me my sense of unbelief so that I could repent of my sins and turn with my whole heart to the Lord my God.

Made a bishop he confessed, so all might hear; "I cannot be silent, nor would it be helpful, about all the gifts and graces that the Lord in His mercy bestowed upon me in the land of my slavery. Indeed this is how we ought to behave. After being punished by God we must praise Him and tell of His marvels to every nation under the heavens... whoever wishes can laugh at me and insult me, I will not be silent nor shall I hide the signs and wonders that the Lord has shown me... God... grant that I may spend my very self on your behalf" The devil damns souls by reassuring them St. Patrick saved souls by preaching the word of God.

There will be a mass, maybe masses, of reparation for the sins committed in the house of the Lord. We too should add our prayers by praying a novena to St. Patrick, to battle "against the black laws of pagandom, against the false laws of heretics, against the craft of idolatry, against spells...and wizards, against every knowledge that corrupts man's body and soul."

Mind, the injury done was to our Lord, the deleterious effects to the faithful, to those who have done evil, every one of us, these words of St. Patrick, the conclusion of his letter to Coroticus;

"It is my earnest desire that everyone who serves God may promptly deliver this letter. In this way there will be no chance of it being sent back or hidden from anybody. Rather it should be read aloud and with strength before all peoples, even where Coroticus himself is present. In this way if God inspire someone to turn back to God, he may even at this late stage repent of his most heinous crime... In this way they will deserve to live with God and be saved now and for all eternity in the peace of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.'





### Fourth Degree Italian Dinner Friday, March 2



Brother Knights,

There is a group called Arizona for Abortion Access that is attempting to collect enough signatures to get on the ballot the ability for women to get abortion in Arizona. They have been pushing the signatures at grocery stores, libraries, and other locations. The people who are pushing this are backed by big money including Planned Parenthood.


