The mission of Safe Environment Training is to prevent sexual, physical, or emotional abuse and/or neglect of children and young people through continued education, building awareness, and maintaining a commitment to keeping all children and young people safe. Different training sessions are designed for parents, youth, and volunteers serving in ministries. Training is available ONLINE! Class descriptions, requirements and registration are available at

phoenix.cmgconnect.org.

The Diocese of Phoenix is committed to protecting all children and youth by offering abuse prevention educational sessions. All adult volunteers must complete the initial Safe Environment for Lay People Foundation Training. This program teaches the steps that can be taken to prevent child sexual abuse.

Additional requirements include:

Complete a volunteer application Attest to the Code of Ethics Consent to a background check

The Diocesan Policy and Procedure for the Protection of Minors requires annual training for:


All Clergy Employees

Volunteers that directly serve minors

All Minors - each year, in Children's Faith Formation classes, in grades Pre-K through high school, every student participates in a Safe Environment program during their class time.

All other parish volunteers must renew Safe Environment training every other year.

Renewal training is offered online for all subsequent years.



At the October pancake breakfast, I entered into a conversation regarding Thanksgiving with some other Knights and their family members. We all noticed that Christmas merchandise was already in stores with Halloween being just weeks away. No sign of turkeys or pilgrims, anywhere. Do you remember the pilgrims? On a Thanksgiving morning a some years ago, I needed to make a last minute run to Fry's for something my wife needed for a dish she was making. There was an apparent homeless man sitting at the entrance of the parking lot. He had a foam chest with him and a sign simply reading "Help". While at the store, I picked up a sandwich and a case of water for him. When I delivered the goods to him, he thanked me and asked "what am I going to do with all this food"? His foam chest was full. I wasn't the only one who came to his aid that day. He may have had a feast of his own for a few days. I prayed that he had someone to share his holiday with.

Many of us give time on our Thanksgiving to help in various kitchens assisting with feeding the needy. Isn't this too, a true expression of being thankful? So, whether you help others by donating food, money, your time or more be a little or a lot, know that those you help do appreciate your concern. Remember the first principle of our order...charity. As for how I celebrate Thanksgiving...I don't watch football. I don't start my Christmas shopping on Thanksgiving either. My wife and I no longer prepare a dinner. That's my son's "holiday" if you will. Yes, we have a family gathering made up of families of mixed faiths and ethnic backgrounds. We leave politics at the doorstep and everyone shares in the love and appreciation of each other. To me, that's what I am most thankful for.

This Thanksgiving, I am also thankful to all who have expressed concern and prayed for me. I am truly thankful to God as once again He has seen me through so that I can continue doing what He wants me to do. I am by all accounts doing well. Thank you, my Brothers. Happy Thanksgiving!
